Hensley Field Operations Center. First green building in the City of Dallas. Mandate for LEED Silver and 39 credits; achieved LEED Gold and 44 credits. Adaptive reuse on brownfield site. Geothermal heat pump system. Extensive site and storm water filtration work. Led the way for a wave of green building through the city.



NE Texas Community College, Mt. Pleasant, TX. First LEED Platinum, Net Zero agricultural facility in the country. Wind and solar power generation fills all building requirements. Integrated design and fabrication of roof truss system saved material, time and budget. Net energy surplus from solar of more than \$4000 through first nine months of operation.



Rapid ROI with energy systems upgrades. Lighting, controls and HVAC system conversions with payback of I.3 years and less. Utility rebates of 25 percent or more. Major facility impact for companies such as Sterilite and Flowserve, as well as institutional clients with fixed operating budgets.



Bedford Public Library, Bedford, TX. Geothermal heating and cooling. Extensive rooftop solar array. High efficiency LED lighting. Advanced features coupled with sustainable processes employed on the project make it LEED Gold credit-eligible.



McLennan Community College Science Building, Waco, TX. HWH served as construction manager on this project, designed for LEED Silver but eligible for LEED Gold. HWH fabricated all of the steel and delivered a GMP \$1.5 million under the owner's original budget.
